JOIN HANDS TO FIGHT AGAINST COVID - 19

As is known, the COVID-19 pandemic broke out and spread rapidly across many cities and provinces in the country. To avoid infection, in the past three months, schools and public places have had to shut down activities. People seriously implemented social separation in accordance with state regulations.

Facing that situation, many poor working families have been facing difficulties when services, companies, and enterprises temporarily stopped production. Life seems to have turned upside down, jobs became scarce, leading to unemployment and families being unable to find income. FFSC with the support of benefactors such as Mr. and Mrs. Phil-Frances Maclaurin, Premier Oil Company and employees, Mr. Stephen Morrell of Trainor Company has supported 3 months of food for 331 poor households and 1-month rent for 92 households. For some families who are facing more difficulties to pay rent, two months of rent assistance will be provided.







Beneficiaries include families of students of FFSC Centers, families of students in the program's scholarship group, and some disadvantaged families in other districts in the city. The total funding for this support campaign is 505 million VND.







In addition, students from Binh An center received some gifts generously offered by some philanthropists.









FFSC would like to thank our benefactors for helping us. Hopefully, together, we will unite in our determination to fight against the pandemic so that the students can return to school soon and everyone can settle down.

SCHOLARSHIP PRESENTATION-2020

n the afternoon of June 14, 2020, the Friends for Street Children (FFSC) association held a meeting for recipients of the FFSC scholarship at Binh Trieu Development Center. Other participants of the meeting were Sr. Le Thi Thao - program director, Mr. Phil, and Mrs. Frances Maclaurin - sponsors of the scholarship.











The meeting was organized for the students to share experiences and learn from each other. To start the

meeting, Ms. Nguyen Thi Hoa from the Worldwide Orphans Foundation (WWO) spent 90 minutes sharing with the students about "EMOTION REGULATION AND MANAGEMENT". This topic is necessary for students to learn how to identify and to manage their emotions, to regulate and express their emotions, and to make negative emotions positive. Students need to have a healthy lifestyle that won't affect their studies as well as other life aspects. Ms. Huong, FFSC's scholarship manager reported the result of the 1st semester of the 2019 - 2020 academic year and granted gifts to students with good academic results.

SOME THOUGHTS AFTER A HOME VISIT



I was lucky and grateful to experience for one morning the distribution of free food to several underprivileged families in HCMC (District 8) that benefit from FFSC to send their kids to school. We were hearty welcome by all families. Their very precarious housing conditions unfortunately came as no surprise to me as I previously experienced central Africa for several

months. However, I had never been able to witness the intimacy of disadvantaged people until this event

occurred. Thus, it felt heartbreaking to listen to some parts of their stories. For example, a boy with a permanent eye injury caused by a bird, or a young teenager who lives as HIV positive due to her drug-addicted parents. Also, a 70-year-old lady who is looking after her 2 great grandchildren as her children and grandchildren fell into using hard drugs. This woman goes every day to collect plastic bottles and plastic bags from garbages in order to earn an estimate of 50,000 VND/day (1,95€) i.e. 60€/month. To this end, her expenses







include the rent of a 12m2 home, electricity, food, and basic needs.

Most of the kids that I encountered expressed large smiles and behaved with endless cuteness and energy. A 5-year-old girl offered one sweet to each of us.

Despite my sweat due to the heat outside, I came out speechless and thoughtful. Thoughtful as where to start to build sustainable improvements to these fragile

families.

Education is one of the pillars to escape from this vicious circle of poverty. Hence, my respect for the Catholic sisters of FFSC is even more strengthened. The inspiration that they generate due to their hard work and for dedicating their life to serve the weakest no matter what religion they believe in.

he Covid -19 spread has caused much trouble. It is a great concern for the society, especially teachers and students who are off from work and school. Here is what teachers and students at FFSC think about this pandemic.



Foreword: Ms. Nguyen Thi Suong is a teacher at Binh An Center. After 4 months of school closure due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the center has reopened and she is able to return to her students. Below is her reflection on the significant changes she has gone through during this historical moment.

The first day after the long absence due to the Covid-19 pandemic, I was elated to see all the familiar endearing faces of the family at Binh An Center.

Looking back, it was as if life slowed down. Everyone's world turned upside down. Schools were closed. No one left home unless it was absolutely necessary. The quarantine took away a lot but at the same time, my family had grown more cautious in our routine, transport, mask wearing, and handwashing. The slow pace of the quarantine routine helped me realize what I might have missed before in the midst of a bustling rat race.

I have witnessed how kind people can be, helping, empathizing, sharing the burden with each other. The pandemic-brought loss of income had a good side to it, incentivizing everyone to spend on what was essential.

The pandemic also brought a unique opportunity for families to be around each other, making up for all the missed meals and failed promises.

I am now more aware than ever how valuable and what a privilege being able to teach once again is. I will try harder to teach the children all the necessary skills and knowledge to better themselves. And above all, I want to teach them to value what the Sisters and teachers from Binh An Center have given them and not to take it for granted.

I will never forget the happiness I got and the friends I gained at the place named "Peace" (Bình An).

At the start of the 2020 academic year, students enjoyed their Tet holiday till February 3rd, 2020. Unexpectedly, the pandemic which was first found in China spread to many countries. It was so dangerous a disease that all schools were closed for a period of time.

My mother contacted my teacher to receive materials for my study at home during the pandemic. I sometimes called and texted my friends to check on them as well as to learn together. I feel that people were more caring and supporting during that period of time. Those who are more wealthy offered free rice and water to the poor. Everyone was all in to fight against the pandemic. Not being able to go to school, I missed my classroom, my teachers, my friends and I missed attending classes, shuttlecock kicking, and jumping robes. The long break has now come to an end and the spread has been reduced. Children are back to school, but everyone needs to put on a face mask, use hand gel and they must not share the same glass of water. In the class, each student needs to keep a distance and sit on a separate table. At the end of the first school day, I heard from my mother that even though the number of infected cases in Vietnam had reduced, that of other countries was still high. There is an increasing number of fatality due to the pandemic.

I hope that the pandemic will end soon so that everyone will live a normal and happy life and there will be no more death.



My Lien (Grade 4, Binh Tho center)

After returning to my hometown to celebrate Tet, I returned to Ho Chi Minh City to hear about the pandemic caused by Coronavirus. I was very sad because I could not go to school. During the break, I helped my mother do housework such as cooking, washing dishes, sweeping the floor, washing clothes, taking care of my siblings... In addition, I also worked part-time for a children's clothes shop for a few days.





I thought I was about to return to school when I was told I had to continue staying at home, I was very sad. But in the end, after a few months, I can finally go back to school now. I am very happy to see my friends and my teachers at school again. And I just hope this pandemic will soon come to an end.

Le Gia Huy (Grade 3, Binh Tho center)

During 2 months off from school because of Covid-19, I stayed at home to help my family. Due to the construction of a new apartment building near my house, during the pandemic, my family still sold meals to the workers working on the project.

Since my family sells meals, I have to wake up at 5 a.m. to help my grandmother. I know how to cook rice and boil eggs. My grandmother makes other dishes. My family starts selling at 9 AM and usually finishes at 1 PM. Afterwards, I arrange the tables and sweep and clean.



I couldn't go anywhere for two months at home. I also didn't get to see my friends so I was very sad. I just hung around the house and played by myself so I was very bored.

Ever since I heard the announcement of going back to school, I have been so happy because I am able to go to school and see my friends again.





Nguyen Hoang Luan (Grade 5, Binh An Development Center)

I think that I had a once-in-a-life-time holiday having months off due to Covid-19.

I did my homework when staying home. According to the social distance rule, I needed to stay home and could not meet up with my classmates.

I helped my mother to babysit my sister during this time.

I was happy to hear the news on TV that the pandemic was under control in Vietnam. I can gather with my friends now, but what's more important is that I can get back to school.



Nguyen Van Long (Grade 5, Binh An Development Center)

I feel sad not to be able to go to school to prepare for the level transfer exam due to Covid-19.

One thing that sprang on my mind during the break is the idea of dropping out of school and seeking a job to support my parents. A few days later, I realized it was not a good idea, so I decided to put a real focus on my learning. I was over the moon to hear that I could finally go back to school.

I hope that I could get these irrational thinking off my mind and try hard at studying when I am back to school.
